**UPON APPLICATIONS** by the Attorney General of Canada, Attorney General of Ontario, Public Interest Litigation Institute, Consumers Council of Canada, Meta Platforms Inc., Samuelson-Glushko Canadian Internet Policy & Public Interest Clinic, Criminal Lawyers' Association (Ontario) and Pass Herald Ltd. for leave to intervene in the above appeal;

**AND UPON APPLICATION** by the Pass Herald Ltd. for an order extending the time to serve and file its motion for leave to intervene;

**AND THE MATERIAL FILED** having been read;

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:**

The motion for extension of time is granted.

The motions for leave to intervene are granted, and the eight (8) interveners shall each be entitled to serve and file a factum not to exceed ten (10) pages in length and book of authorities, if any, on or before June 9, 2026.

The eight (8) interveners are each granted permission to present oral argument not exceeding five (5) minutes at the hearing of the appeal.

The appellants and the respondents shall each be entitled to serve and file a single factum in reply to all interventions, not to exceed ten (10) pages in length on or before June 23, 2026.

**The interveners are not entitled to express a position on the disposition of the appeal, to raise new issues, to adduce further evidence or otherwise to supplement the record of the parties.**

**The interveners are not permitted to advance submissions that duplicate those of the other parties.**

Pursuant to Rule 59(1)(a) of the *Rules of the Supreme Court of Canada*, the interveners or shall pay to the appellant and the respondent any additional disbursements resulting from their respective interventions.
